
POPULATION STATUS OF AMERICAN EEL

- Please summarize the information you have about the biology and status of American eel in your country.
 - The American eel (*Anguilla rostrata*) is found in Jamaica, however, not much is known about its status in local rivers and streams.
 - At this time, there is still lack of information on the population size, population trends, geographic distribution, or threats to the species. Currently, through the Fisheries Division they are collaborating with permitted licensed fishers to gather this data.

o This experimental licence was granted for a period of 3 years commencing in October 2013 with a view to partnering with the Fisheries Division to develop our understanding of the species as well as to determine the environmental and economic feasibility of a commercial fishery in Jamaican waters



 - What life stages are harvested
 - American Eel are usually harvested at the Glass Eel / Elvers (juvenile) stages

 - They are exported to Hong Kong via Canada


What quantities are harvested

- In **2013** a total of 4 rivers were visited of which **45.5kg** of eels were reported as caught.
 - During this period of which only **23.5kg or 52%** was exported and reported to have arrived at their overseas grow-out market healthy.
- In **2014 to 2015** there were 85 rivers visited with approximately **76** *kgs* of glass eels were reported as caught.
 - None of these quantities were exported due to low quantities being caught at any one time and low quality (dark pigmentation)
- In **2015 to 2016** there were 9 rivers sampled during this period yielding *114kg* of glass eels were reported as caught.
 - All of which were reported to have been released or discarded due to small numbers and poor quality
- In **2016 to 2017** there were 9 rivers sampled over a combined 840 fishing nights resulting in the capture of *127kg* of glass eels.
 - Of this quantity only 30kg or roughly 24% was retained and exported with the rest discarded to poor quality and unsuitability for export.

 - The Fishing Industry Act 1975 governs the licensing and registration of fishers and vessels and provides for regulations to protect and sustainably manage any fishery in Jamaica through close seasons, fish sanctuaries or other means necessary.
 - The Aquaculture, Inland and Marine Products and By-Products (Inspection, Licensing and Export) Act & Regulations 1999 and its amendment regulates the harvesting, processing and exportation of all fish, fishery products and its by-products.

DOMESTIC FARMING OF AMERICAN EEL

- Are American eels farmed in your country?
 - No, we do not commercially farm eels, they are all usually wild caught

TRADE OF AMERICAN EEL

- Do you export or import American eels in your country?
 - If yes, what life stages or type of products?
 - Jamaica exports at the Glass eel/ juvenile stage
 - What quantities are imported and exported?
 - Approximately 85 kgs of the amount harvested were exported since 2013 (they are usually harvested and exported at the rate of two(2) quarts of river water to one(1) kilo of elvers)
